

**Robert J. Reid, P. Eng.**  
**President, Aboriginal Pipeline Group**

Bob joined the Aboriginal Pipeline Group in November, 2003. APG was formed in June, 2000 with a mandate to maximize benefits to northern Aboriginal communities through ownership in the Mackenzie Valley Pipeline. Today, APG holds a 33.3% interest in the Pipeline, and is actively participating in the development of this important project.

Bob is best-known for his 33-year career at TransCanada PipeLines, where he served as President, Energy Transmission, and as Senior Vice President, Northern Development, responsible for implementing a plan to access frontier supplies of natural gas. Following his retirement from TransCanada in 2000, Bob became an Executive Associate with Ziff Energy Group.

During his career at TransCanada, Bob was instrumental in negotiating the first deregulated price for natural gas in Canada, and also consummated the first Incentive Rate Settlement for a natural gas pipeline in North America. As President of Iroquois Gas Transmission, he successfully overcame significant public opposition and political controversy to connect western Canadian gas to growing markets in the U.S. Northeast.

Mr. Reid holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering from the University of Saskatchewan, and a Master of Applied Science degree in Management Science from the University of Waterloo. Mr. Reid has been a keynote speaker at numerous industry conferences and seminars. He is an honorary Life Member of the Canadian Gas Association, and a Past Chair of the Canadian Energy Pipeline Association.
